From Pastor Brant...

Give us this day our daily bread...

Before this virus rudely interrupted our Lenten Journey, I was in the middle of a sermon series on the Lord's Prayer. Jesus offered this prayer in response to an invitation from the disciples to "teach us to pray." It is my thinking that this prayer is offered to us as a thematic guide for us to follow that our prayer lives might lead us further into the heart of God.

The next theme in the series is presented in the fourth petition, "Give us this day our daily bread.... This is the first time in the Lord's Prayer, and by now we are half way in, that we are invited to turn toward our own needs. The first three petitions have been directed toward the person and the purposes of God. It is now, after we have gained the proper perspective about our place in God's world, that we are invited to bring to God our needs and our understandings of the needs of our world.

In this time the petition, "Give us this day our daily bread," may grab your attention more than usual. Usually if we are anxious about our daily bread it is because we are wondering what we are going to eat next and not <u>if</u> we are going to eat. With the physical distancing that is mandated these days, this isn't so. Grocery stores are still open, but we are aware that things are different. There is a scarcity of some items that might be a little unsettling to us. In the checkout lines there is tape on the floor to remind you to stay 6 feet apart. You can take advantage of the pick-up services, but they take some days to fill.

This petition serves as a reminder, that we have a dependency on the goodness and generosity of God that we tend to lose sight of from time to time. This has been brought back into focus. What we eat and consume depends completely on materials that are part of God's good creation.

Jesus reminds us as well that we do not live by bread alone, that we have all sorts of regular needs for which we depend on God; to join together for worship and encouragement, to read a good book or pursue some hobby or activity. Maybe you are more aware than ever of your need for human contact, for a friendly look, for a handshake, or a hug, or a kiss.

The petition reminds us as well that we are not just praying for ourselves only, *Give us....* It invites us to remember in prayer the many people of whom we are aware whose daily needs might not be met. Who are the children and families who are hungry because the backpack program isn't up and running like we are used to? How are the healthcare professionals doing as they face shortages of materials that are usually available to them in abundance that are essential to protecting them from illness and disease? How are the unemployed people dealing with the anxiety and uncertainty around finances? In this time when we are so aware of the needs of those around us, when we might experience some helplessness in responding to these needs because of the changes that have come so quickly to our community, God invites each one of us to share our concerns and fears with God. We are entrusting the care of others to God, believing that God can and will respond to those needs that are beyond us.

The power in this petition lies in its ability to make us aware of how God knows our needs, God's willingness to meet those needs, and how, when we recognize that our own needs are being met in abundant ways, how it frees us to be generous stewards of all that God has placed within our care.

I invite you this week to focus on this petition, to discern what needs you have and what needs others might have, and then to bring before God. Then wait and see what God will do.

Tidbits of information from Session/Council meeting of March 17, 2020 that you may find helpful:

Opening: Reflection on Psalm 23.

Clerk's Report: Church membership is now 129 with addition of new member Ron Platt on 3-1-20. Welcome, Ron. Communion was served on February 26, 2020 to 31 parishioners and on March 1, 2020 to 62 parishioners.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Brant gave his report on his service to the congregation, the community, and the denomination. He included the multiple hospital and home visits and his meetings with various study groups and committees, both at Countryside Trinity and community that he serves on. He has met with the social worker and the principal at Weiss School. He led worship for the Women's Ministry Association and participated in the Ezekiel project. He included various discussions that he had had over the last 1-2 weeks regarding the COVID-19 virus and its impact on churches and the community.

Denominational Report: M. Lacker served as commissioner to Presbytery meeting on March 7th at Saginaw, Korean Church. Topic was "Spirituality of Stewardship."

Approximately 10-15 members plus family members came to help us celebrate with these delightful, blessed women. Ice cream and cake was served. A good time was had by all!

At the session meeting we discussed how the church will respond to this present pandemic. Some plans were made pertaining to reaching out to our vulnerable members/friends. Spiritual Life Committee will review options for the various events. In these trying times, we will find different ways to continue our ministry.

Saturday's activities give you many opportunities to either stay busy in workshops or simply enjoy the beautiful surroundings of Kettunen Center. Sunday offers a Sunday school class and a very meaningful worship service. There also will be a business meeting. The Kettunen Center is located in the woods on a beautiful lake. <u>Christian Outreach</u>: The Missions of the Month are the Underground Railroad and The baby Pantry.

The Underground Railroad serves victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking and human slavery in Saginaw County. Right now there are over 100 people, many are children, housed at their facilities.

A list of what a donation can fund highlights the scope of the programs offered.

- \$75 Fund the Crisis Helpline for 24 hours
- \$100 Fund a night emergency center for a family of four fleeing abuse
- \$150 Fund vaccines, treatments, food and supplies needed to house a pet with a family for 30 days.
- \$185 Fund one Girl on the Run for a program of 10 weeks to build joy, health and confidence.
- \$200 Fund teaching a Healthy Relation curriculum to 100 area students.
- \$250 To feed the entire shelter for a week.
- \$300 To fund 200 loads of laundry of residents for 2 weeks.
- \$350 To fund 2 children for 1 week in the free on sight day care.
- \$440 To pay utilities for 9 off site transitional and permanent supportive housing units.

Please give generously.

The Baby Pantry is one of the Old Town missions. Baby layettes and furniture are available to new moms. Each mom also receives a book to read to her baby.


