From Pastor Brant...

As [Jesus] came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, "Look, Teacher, what large stones and what large buildings!" Then Jesus asked him, "Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down." --Mark 13:1-2

It is quite apparent that Jesus does not have much interest in buildings. When it comes to the church, Jesus has other structures in mind, relational ones, ones in which people interact with one another in ways which demonstrate the loving nature of God.

Through the grace of God, we have been given an opportunity to support and nurture an organization that is devoted to investing in the lives of young people in our community. Last Tuesday, January 19th, the session voted to become the Charter Organization for Scout Troop 304. With this action the church will be opening its doors to young people who are always in need of caring adults to provide wisdom, guidance, and compassion as they face the challenges of adolescence. The session, in taking this action, believes that it will give to our members personal ways to minister to these people. Troop 304 can become a focus of our prayer life as we lift up these young people as well as the cadre of adults who devote themselves to leadership positions in the troop and in the larger structures which oversee the troop. It will be included in our the list of recipients of our financial resources as we cover not only the yearly expense of being its charter organization (\$75), but also support the troop's efforts to provide subsidies to families who need them to cover the annual costs of Scout activities. You will be invited to participate in their additional fundraising opportunities, especially the troop's annual Spaghetti Dinner. How else might you help this ministry? Perhaps they will need help with meals, along with the Spaghetti Dinner. I am also thinking that they will need help with resources to help the young people earn their merit badges. What skills might you possess to help in these areas.

It will be important for us to listen for what these needs might be. Engaging these young people in conversation, along with their leaders, is a good place to start. Don't expect them to have ready answers. You will have to listen closely, and when you think you have heard of a need, ask if you have perceived the needs correctly.

I want to be clear that this is our ministry to these young people. We have not accepted this invitation with the idea that they will be doing something for us. This may happen. It may be that their needs and ours will have a divine synchronicity. We are here to serve them; we are here to offer our resources, not only our building, but our hearts and skills and prayers, that the mission of this troop, to develop responsible and compassionate adults will succeed.

I would invite you to ask for guidance in your prayers for how God would like you to support this ministry.

January 19, 2021

Following a period of reflection, thanksgiving, and prayer, reports were received.

Clerk's report: Church membership stable at 123.

Pastor's report: Service to Presbytery and to the church.

Building & Grounds: Motion sustained to become a charter organization for scout troop 304 and to pay annual fee for the troop following discussion. We will be providing a storage room and meeting area for them. This troop is very "community service" oriented.

Finance & Stewardship: Pledges for 2021 are still below the number and amount pledged for 2020.

Christian Outreach: Six families received food only gift cards for Christmas. There was money left over that will be disbursed to local food pantry or more food only gift cards.

December 15, 2020

A request was received from an organized Scout troop for Countryside Trinity to become its Charter Organization. This request was discussed and a decision was made to continue to explore the commitments it will require of us and the ways we might support this organization and its ministry to our community. Presently the Scouts are not meeting.

The Stewardship and Finance team invites those who have yet to pledge, to please send in your pledge card to the church office. This year has presented CTC with many challenges in how we minister to our congregation and our community, and this information is helpful as the session continues to seek out new opportunities for service.

The session approved new office hours for our Administrative Assistant: Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday from 8:30 AM to 1:30 PM year-round. (NO change during the summer months).

<u>Celebration of the Lord's Supper and Scout Sunday, February 7th</u>: During our worship on February 7th, we will be celebrating the Lord's Supper and Scout Sunday. You are invited once again to gather before you the elements of the bread and the cup so that you might fully participate in this sacred celebration.

Offering Envelopes are available to be picked up: Lori Halase has made the boxes of offering envelopes available during the week for pickup. To pick yours up, please first call the church office to make an appointment to ensure both that someone will be here to unlock the door for you, and to pick up your offering envelope if you want to drop it off, and also to help us keep the number of people coming into the church building manageable. The boxes will be on the table on the left side as you come in the East door, each one in its own plastic bag. Please wear a mask as you enter, and exit as quickly as you can.

PROTOCOLS FOR COUNTRYSIDE TRINITY CHURCH UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

In an abundance of caution and until it is safe to relax these procedures, the following protocols will be required before entering the building:

- 1. Appointments are required. Please call the office (989) 793-0125 to set up a convenient time Monday-Thursday in the mornings.
- 2. Enter the building only through the east door near the office
- 3. YOU MUST WEAR A MASK WHILE INSIDE THE BUILDING. Free masks are available in the entrance hall.
- 4. Fill out the Registration Sheet on the table immediately inside the door to the left, recording your answers to the Screening Questionnaire and your temperature as shown on example below. To take your temperature, place the thermometer near your forehead and squeeze the button. Your temperature will show up on the screen (please note that if it is cold outside, you may need to place the thermometer close to a location which was covered by your coat in order to get an accurate reading (forearm, neck, etc). If you are not feeling well, or your temperature is above 100.4° F please do not come into the church.
