#### From Your Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ,

It has been a beautiful autumn. I hope all of you have had the opportunity to enjoy the pleasures of this season—the crisp, cool air, the laughter of children in their costumes, the smell of cinnamon and spice, and the crunching bite of a fresh picked apple or the warm deliciousness of a homemade pie. It is soup and sweater time as days get shorter and nights grow colder. November has struck as the perfect time to consider the blessings of life. It is a time of thanksgiving.

A famous quote from H.U. Westermayer goes like this, "The Pilgrims made seven times more graves than huts. No Americans have been more impoverished than these who, nevertheless, set aside a day of thanksgiving." Think about that for a moment, the odds were 7 to 1 against survival for these travelers and still they felt it necessary to set aside some time to offer thanks to God. All of them had seen their fair share of sea sickness, disease and suffering, even most likely the death of some of their children and parents—and still they chose gratitude over anger and resentment toward God; they chose hope over despair, they chose praise instead of complaint.

One of the dilemmas of Interim ministry is the issue of timing. What I mean is that some programs and events take a little longer to get off the ground. One of these events this year for me is the annual stewardship campaign. Soon the Stewardship Committee will be sending you more information about the campaign and their hopes for the mission and ministry of Countryside Trinity. I have been asked over the years what makes for a good stewardship program. I usually answer with a one word response: Attitude. The answer usually surprises the inquisitor which leads to a much deeper conversation. (Continued on Page 2)

When I speak of attitude I mean it in many ways. Stewardship is about the "Attitude of Gratitude". From my perspective stewardship is not primarily about a specific program, nor is it about the church budget, nor is it about the church building. Granted all of programs, budgets and buildings benefit from the gifts received through the stewardship of each and every giver—but faithful stewardship occurs when we realize that all that we have, all that we are is a gift, and that each of these gifts brings up from the depths of our soul a sense of thankfulness, an attitude of gratitude. If stewardship does not begin with a deep sense of gratitude toward the gifts that God has given us it is not stewardship but simply fund raising masked in church speak.

The mystic Meister Eckhart once said, *If the only prayer you said in your whole life was, "thank you," that would suffice."* Faithful stewardship is taking that prayer and putting it into action—through our service to others, through our continual praise and worship of God, through the giving of our gifts to lift the souls who feel that the odds of their life are 7 to 1 in favor of death.

So what are you thankful for today? What do you hear and see and feel around you that gives you that attitude of gratitude? What do you taste and what comforts do you share with those around you for which you are grateful? And finally, what insurmountable struggle, what arduous journey have you traversed, what indescribable pain have you been through and have somehow found yourself now on the other side only by the grace of God—which causes you to sing today, "Praise God from whom all blessings flow!"

#### **BIBLE INSIGHTS**

#### The Psalms of David

Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth! Serve the Lord with gladness! Come into his presence with singing! Know that the Lord, He is God! It is He who made us, and we are His; we are His people, and the sheep of His pasture. Enter His gates with thanksgiving, and His courts with praise! Give thanks to Him; bless His name! For the Lord is good; His steadfast love endures forever, and His faithfulness to all generations. Psalm 100:1-5 ESV

Gratitude is an attitude that comes out of the habit of giving thanks. All through the Psalms, no matter what David was facing, we read his outpouring of gratitude to God. As he encountered good times and bad times, David always turned back to the truth of God's goodness. This attitude often carried him through the hardest of situations. Use this example to teach your child that gratitude is a habit that is learned through practice. Just as we teach little ones to say please and thank you through repetition and relentless reminders, we learn to express our thanks to the Father through consistency. Yet, while gratitude is a habitual attitude, we want our thanksgiving to come out of a genuine heart. The more we meditate on God's goodness and practice our thanks no matter what our circumstance, the more it will naturally flow out of a heart that loves Him.

**Opening:** Pastor Dave opened the meeting with a reflection and devotional reading from Philippians 2:3.

**Previous Business:** Pastor Dave reported that the Presbytery Committee on Ministry had approved our request to form a Pastor Nominating Committee "when we are ready".

They all live in close proximity of each other. Mary Ann treasures family time with them all. Besides spending time with her children and grandchildren, Mary Ann enjoys knitting, cooking, and cake decorating. She is an avid golfer and enjoys going out to lunch or on day excursions with her friends. She is also involved with the Saginaw General Alumni Association and has served on the Presbytery nominating team for the past five years.

The Parkers came to Countryside after Grace Presbyterian closed. Countryside Trinity Church is blessed to have a member who is as dedicated and hard working as Mary Ann. She currently works tirelessly as our Clerk of Session and has held many offices and positions here at CTC over the years. She also lends her beautiful soprano voice to our choir.
