

FROM THE PASTOR ---- REV. NATHANIEL ASPERGER

Greetings to you all in the name of Jesus the Christ!

I remember being a child and like most children, I complained about time. The adults in my life would often say something along the lines of, "don't worry, time gets faster as you get older". As we are already in June, I resonate with time seeming to go fast. Being in the midway part of the year brings with it a good moment to sit back and reflect on what we have done this year, and what we would like yet to do.

Towards the end of last year, I decided to reflect on the Jewish practice of sabbath this year. In reflecting, I have not done as well as I would like. In life things seem to keep popping up, kid's events, family events, responsibilities in all different directions. At times, it seems that sabbath, intentional resting both physically and spiritually, gets put off just a little. Someone calls, something happens, it's the best time to grocery shops, all sorts of things pop up on those days for sabbath rest. As I started to reflect on things, I realized one of the things I let go by the wayside was a Jewish prayer for the sabbath. The prayer that I had chosen is unique to some of our church prayers, in the way that it dedicates our rest. The prayer is as follows:

"Our God and God of our fathers, accept our rest; sanctify us by thy commandments, and grant our portion of thy Law; satisfy us with thy goodness, and gladden us with thy salvation; purify our hearts to serve thee in truth; and in they love and favor, O Lord our God, let us inherit thy holy Sabbath; and may Israel, who hallow thy name, rest thereon. Blessed art thou, O Lord, who hollowest the Sabbath".

Now the language is old English, but the power of the statements is insightful to consider. The prayer starts with dedicating our rest, as a holy part of our discipleship. It highlights the goodness of God and all the blessings that come from the Almighty. It ends by returning to the fact that sabbath is holy, and hollowed by God, referencing Genises. I find the reflection of this prayer to be useful in recentering myself towards respecting good sabbath practices.

A couple of things for you to consider. First-like myself-what do you want to do better for the rest of the year? What has been good and blessed? What has fallen by the wayside? Second, I encourage you to consider your sabbath practices. Do you sabbath wholistically? Meaning do you rest in your physical, spiritual and mental energies? Do you seek renewal in the almighty, through scripture and prayer?

This year has moved past quickly, it seems every minute there are a multitude of events, news stories and things to read and do. Consider what you have done, and what you would like to do. Also, remember to sabbath with the Lord.

PER CAPITA DONATIONS

As church members we are reminded annually that we must pay a per capita tax to our denomination. This money usually goes toward paying expenses at the higher level than our own immediate church. Since we are a two-denomination church (Presbyterian and United Church of Christ), we receive two bills for per capita. The denominations base the total per capita on the number of members that the church reports. Also, please bear in mind that since we are two denominations, all of our membership statistics that are submitted to the two denominations annually are divided in half. For instance, if we have 100 members, the report to each denomination will be 50 members. The Presbytery bill for us covers 50 members, so it is actually to our benefit. We also receive a bill for a lesser amount from UCC based on 50 members.

With this in mind, the Session has approved a request to be made to the members to pay \$30.00 per capita for 2025. Just a gentle reminder that the per capita is per member, not per household. So, if you have four people in your household that are members of Countryside Church, you are asked to pay for all four people a total of \$120.00. In order to defray the expense of the per capita, the Session is asking that members assist the church by paying their own per capita of \$30.00/member for 2025. We do not want to put a hardship on anyone, but these bills must be paid whether our treasury gets help from the members or not. There will be an envelope marked "per capita" in your box of contribution envelopes that you will be receiving in the next few weeks that you can use.

The Session appreciates your help in this matter.




