### FROM THE PASTOR ---- REV. NATHANIEL ASPERGER

Greetings to you all in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ!

Here we are in the new year! For some, this is an exciting time to choose resolutions for this year. Or, it is deciding what new thing they are going to 'try' for a period of time. I am personally not a "new year, new me" kind of person, but I do believe in the importance of goals. When we think of Jesus and his ministry, I do not often hear people talk about goals. However, Jesus definitely had specific things in mind that he set out to accomplish.

Goals are an important thing not just in our personal lives, but to the life of the church. For instance, when the session started in 2025, we talked about our hopes and dreams for Countryside Trinity Church. Within a few months, we had things we wanted to accomplish. From dreams, we moved to goals, things that the Session wanted to create, set in motion or bring to completion in 2025. The Session brought 2 items from dreams, to goals, to accomplished work in Countryside Trinity Church. (Those items were creating a new staff position and starting the Needs Pantry, if you were curious.)

Goals give us meaning in our lives, and no matter our age, we need meaning. I went through seminary with 1 woman who was in her mid-70's, and 1 who was in her 80's. They both entered with different goals after seminary, but first with the goal of honoring God by earning their Master's Degree and becoming eligible to become ministers in the PCUSA. I earned my small engine technician certificate, with several men who were in their 60's. These folks all had goals to learn, grow, and then goals to go do something. I am not advocating to any of you to run out and sign up for a new degree. However, I am asking you what goals you have for yourself?

In my doctorate program last year, I had to really dig into my life, my core beliefs about work, leisure, and my goals in life. In this program, we needed to set goals, 1, 3, and 5 years out. These are things we want/need to accomplish in 7 areas of our lives. (That is 21 goals of varying complexity.) There is a lot of science, research, and recorded history to look at when we think about goals, and much of it shows that even poorly set goals can give one more meaning in life. Without meaning, we slowly do less and less, and satisfaction with our faith, our social lives, and other areas suffers.

As we think about goals in our lives and faith, I invite you to consider what goals you have for yourself. I will be starting a class on thinking about goals and setting reasonable goals for ourselves at all ages. This class will discuss faith and other areas of our lives that setting some sort of goal is useful for. We all struggle at some point to set goals or come up with something for a particular time of life, I invite you to consider coming to this new class.

This will likely be after my hip surgery, so, starting sometime in February. I hope everyone will consider what goals they have for themselves, and if you have none at this time, set some goals for yourself.

Until we meet again, may the Lord bless you and keep you.

- Bath Soap Hand Sanitizer


